<b>Maths</b>	Today we are looking at multi step word problems - have a go at today's problems. Remember they include more than one step.	Questions Answers
<b>English</b>	Watch Road's End again, and this time think about the setting of the story. Would you agree with me if I said it is a jungle or a desert? Research what places in the world may look like this and then make a decision about where this could be set (e.g. the name of the desert, if you think it is a desert or the name of the ocean, if you think it is an ocean). Look at the picture that shows a screenshot of the setting and make a list of all of the things you could describe in the setting-there's a lot, right? Follow the link to see how I will organise my description, beginning wide and then focusing in to my final point. Write a three sentence description of the setting that follows this structure of broad to narrow.
